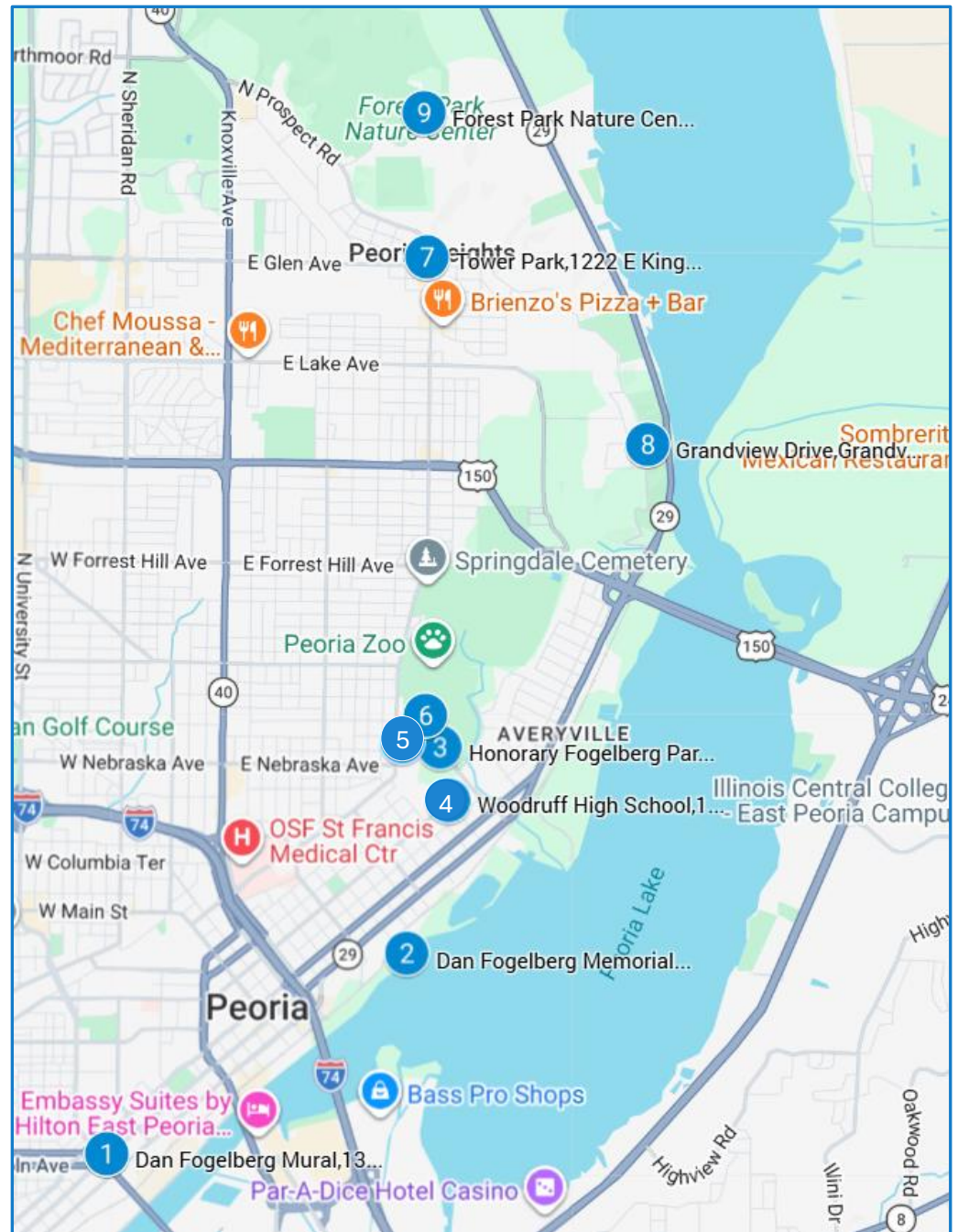

| 1 | <p>Dan Fogelberg Mural: 1323 SW Adams Street</p> <p><i>*Not always on display</i></p> | <p>Sponsored by Big Picture Peoria, the mural is occasionally available for outdoor viewing at the CT Gabbert Remodeling and Construction building. It's one of many that appear in a planned rotation and is not always on display.</p> |
| 2 | <p>The Dan Fogelberg Memorial: 100 Morton Street</p> | <p>Some parking is available at the park. The Memorial is also accessible from the RiverPlex building parking lot at 600 Northeast Water Street. Walk the path upriver into the park. Small lyric boulders line the pathway. Keep right when the pathway splits to arrive at the Memorial.</p> |
| 3 | <p>Honorary Fogelberg Parkway: Corner of Abingdon Street and NE Adams</p> | <p>Named in honor of the entire Fogelberg family, the parkway begins at the corner of Abingdon Street and NE Adams and extends to the northwest to the East Bluff neighborhood at the corner of East Frye Ave. and North Prospect Road.</p> |
| 4 | <p>Woodruff High School: 1800 NE Perry Avenue</p> | <p>Dan's alma mater where his father was the band director during Dan's young life, and where Dan graduated in 1969. Woodruff is now a career and technical training center for the Peoria school district.</p> |
| 5 | <p>Convenience Store (from Same Old Lang Syne): 1302 E Frye Avenue</p> | <p>The heartfelt scenes that Dan describes in his timeless classic, Same Old Lang Syne, played out for real at this location on Christmas Eve, 1975. A six pack of Olympia beer and a couple hours of conversation with a high school girlfriend turned into a song that everyone can relate to.</p> |
| 6 | <p>Glen Oak Amphitheatre: 2218 N. Prospect Road</p> | <p>Here is where Dan performed a joyous homecoming show in 1975 on the night he was awarded Best New Artist of the year. It is not always open to the public but can always be viewed from the outer fencing.</p> |
| 7 | <p>Tower Park: 1222 E. Kingman Avenue – Peoria Heights</p> <p><i>*Open May-October</i></p> | <p>The tower offers one of the most spectacular views of the greater Peoria area. A special plaque dedicated to Dan is located at the top of the tower. Info on hours and admission fee can be found at https://www.peoriaheights.org/tower-park.</p> |
| 8 | <p>Grandview Drive</p> | <p>Head east from Tower Park and follow Grandview Drive for the most inspirational view in town. Located near the intersection of N. Grandview Drive and E. Fairhaven Lane is a bench placed in Dan's honor by a loyal fan.</p> |
| 9 | <p>Forest Park Nature Center: 5809 N. Forest Park Drive</p> | <p>Four large boulders with inscriptions of Dan's lyrics can be found in this beautiful nature center.</p> |
